STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Richard Storer, of Boothbay Harbor; for Injuries.

Richard Storer; compensated for injuries. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$3,000 to be paid to Richard Storer, of Boothbay Harbor, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for injuries received in an accident caused by collision of his motorcycle and a deer; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This accident occurred on October 20, 1945, in Brunswick, and was investigated by Game Warden Philip Mahaney. A deer jumped in front of the motorcycle which Mr. Storer was riding. He was thrown from the motorcycle and injured. An ambulance was called and he was taken to the Brunswick hospital where he was treated for lacerations on the face and leg. The injuries to his face and leg proved permanent; and for these permanent injuries, his hospital and doctor's expenses, pain, suffering, and loss of time from work, he is asking for the compensation set forth in this resolve.
