IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Regulate Public Dance Halls.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 88, § 53-A, additional. Chapter 88 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 53-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 53-A. Public dances, limitation. No public dances shall be held in any pavilion, hall or other building unless the same is equipped with running water and provided with adequate separate toilet facilities for men and women and unless an officer of the law is on hand at all times when dances are being held.'
