IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-SEVEN

**AN ACT Relating to the Town Line Dividing the Towns of Yarmouth and
Cumberland.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town line relocated. The town line dividing the town of Yarmouth and the town of Cumberland in the county of Cumberland is hereby relocated so that the property bordering on the northeasterly side of the Greely road, so called, to wit: property of Stanley B. Haskell, Richard F. Blanchard, and Henry P. Stasinowsky, being all the property now in the town of Yarmouth bordering on this road, be included in the town of Cumberland.

The new monuments necessary to mark this new line shall be established under the provisions of sections 139 and 140 of chapter 80 of the revised statutes, the cost of the monuments to be borne by the town of Cumberland.
