STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Town Line Dividing the Towns of North Yarmouth and Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Town line relocated. The town line dividing the towns of North Yarmouth and Cumberland in the county of Cumberland is hereby relocated so that the property bordering on the northeasterly side of the Rangeway, so called, and the Greely road, so called, to wit: property of E. A. Vaughn, Arthur L. Smith, Frank A. Fickett, and Stanford M. Brown, being all the property now in the town of North Yarmouth bordering on these roads, be included in the town of Cumberland.

The new monuments necessary to mark this new line shall be established under the provisions of sections 139 and 140 of chapter 80 of the revised statutes, the cost of the monuments to be borne by the town of Cumberland.
