STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Lamont and Nellie Bean of Phillips.

Lamont and Nellie Bean; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$250 to be paid to Lamont and Nellie Bean, of Phillips, as a full and final settlement for their claim against the state for damage to their property and buildings caused by drainage from a state road culvert; said sum to be paid from the general highway fund.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Before the state road was built, the drainage from the hills ran straight down Blake hill and into Sandy river. Afterwards, the state turned the water course about midway down the hill through Raymond Ross' field, and at the end of the field Mr. and Mrs. Bean's buildings stand so that they get all the drainage from above. There are 2 culverts, almost side by side, and in early spring or from heavy rains, the water overflows and runs onto their property causing considerable damage.
