IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Increase the Authority of Lafayette Lodge to Hold Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1865, c. 523, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 523 of the private and special laws of 1865 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 1. Corporators; corporate name; place of business; seal; by-laws; may hold real estate, etc.; rights and liabilities. Emery O. Bean, Asa Gile and Cromwell P. Hunton, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of Lafayette Lodge, to be established and have its place of business in Readfield, in the county of Kennebec with power to sue and be sued, to have a common seal, and to change the same; make any by-laws for the management of their own affairs, not inconsistent with the laws of this state; to take and hold, for masonic, charitable and benevolent purposes, real estate to the value of ~~five thousand dollars~~ \$50,000, and personal property to the amount of ~~five thousand dollars~~ \$50,000, with the right to give, bargain, sell and convey the same, and generally to exercise all the rights, and be subject to all the liabilities of corporations in this state created for charitable and benevolent purposes.'
