STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Regulation of Employment Agencies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 88, § 121, amended. Section 121 of chapter 88 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 121. Definitions. The term "person" in the 7 preceding sections shall include a person, company, society, association, firm, or corporation; and the term "employment agency" shall include the business of keeping an intelligence office, employment bureau, or other agency for procuring work or employment for persons seeking employment, or for acting as agent for procuring such work or employment, where a fee or other valuable thing is exacted, charged, or received, or for procuring or assisting to procure employment, work, or situation of any kind or for procuring or providing for any person; but said sections shall not apply to the employment of seamen, nor to teachers' agencies, **nor to nurses' associations,** nor charitable institutions.'
