**RESOLVE, in Favor of a Bridge Across the Penobscot River.**

---

**Bridge over Penobscot river; appropriation for. Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund the sum of \$240,000 for the purpose of constructing a bridge across the Penobscot river in Penobscot county between Lincoln and Chester, in the county of Penobscot.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

At the present time there is no bridge across the Penobscot river from the Howland bridge to the Medway bridge, a distance of about 45 miles. Present ferry facilities are both inadequate and extremely hazardous. A Lincoln-Chester bridge would open a great area capable of substantial contribution to the economy of northern Penobscot county.
