STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in Retirement Pension for Oscar F. Williams.

Oscar F. Williams; retirement pension increased. Resolved: That the retirement pension now being paid to Oscar F. Williams of Thomaston, under the provisions of chapter 60 of the revised statutes be increased by an amount that will give him a retirement benefit of $\frac{1}{2}$ his average final compensation.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Oscar F. Williams served as guard at the Maine state prison for approximately 21 years and was forced to retire in May 1946 at the age of 66, due to ill health. During most of his service at the prison, he worked 10 and 12 hour shifts, 60 and 72 hour weeks.
