RESOLVE, in Favor of Robert J. Greig, of Portland.

Robert J. Greig; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$112.75 to be paid to Robert J. Greig, of 19 Justamere Road, Falmouth Foreside, Portland, as a full and final settlement of all claims against the state for damage to his car by a moose.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The accident occurred on the road to Brunswick near Richmond corner in the county of Sagadahoc on the evening of April 7, 1946 and was investigated by state police officers DeWinters and Charles Marks. The car belonging to Mr. Greig was damaged to the extent of a bent hood, the left front fender was bent and the radiator was broken loose from its support.
