STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relative to Resident Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 63, sub-§ II, amended. The 4th and 5th paragraphs of subsection II of section 63 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby amended to read as follows:

'The license shall be issued to a resident by the clerk of the town in which the applicant resides, or if domiciled in an unorganized territory, then by the clerk of the nearest town, upon payment of a fee of \$\frac{\pmathbf{F}}{4.75}\$ \$\frac{2.25}{2.25}\$, of which \$\frac{4.5e}{4.5e}\$ 25c shall be retained by the town clerk. The commissioner may appoint agents in unorganized towns for the purpose of issuing resident hunting licenses to the residents domiciled in that unorganized town.

A combination of hunting and fishing license may be issued on payment of \$2.+5 \$4.25, +5e 25c to be retained by the town clerk.'

Sec. 2. Effective date. The provisions of this act shall become effective on January 1, 1948.
