STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Roby Littlefield, of Ogunquit.

Roby Littlefield; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$500 to be paid to Roby Littlefield, of Ogunquit, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for loss of his garden and strawberry bed; said sum to be paid from the general fund of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The damage was done August 26, 1946, in the town of Wells, I mile north of Ogunquit Village Square. The fill on the east side of Highway No. I washed down onto the garden and washed away a new strawberry bed. About 1000 yards of rock and gravel were required to fill the hole in the roadway. The state highway commission had been doing road work and due to the fact that the culvert was badly blocked when the storm began and that the side had never been faced in any way to prevent washing, Mr. Littlefield feels that he should be compensated by the state.
