AN ACT to Establish Pine Hill Game Preserve in the Town of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 128, amended. Section 128 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new paragraph, in alphabetical order, to read as follows:

Pine Hill Game Preserve: No person shall at any time, hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild bird or wild animal within the following named territory; beginning at the Atlantic Ocean, at the dividing line between the towns of York and Wells; thence running northwesterly, by the dividing line between said towns, to the easterly side of the highway leading from Wells to York, otherwise known as the State Highway, Post road or U. S. Route Number One; thence running southwesterly, by the easterly side of said highway, to the junction of said highway with the Old Post road or Pine Hill road; thence running easterly, by the northerly side of said last mentioned highway, to a point between the houses of Alice Webb and Edward H. Goodwin; thence crossing said last mentioned highway and following a cart road which passes between said houses of Webb and Goodwin, and running southeasterly and southerly, as said cart road runs, to a point near the Theodore Parsons graveyard, near Phillips' Cove;

thence continuing in a southeasterly direction, by the present cart road over land of Robert J. Hamilton, to the Shore road, so called, leading from Ogunquit to York Beach by way of Bald Head; thence crossing said last mentioned highway to the easterly side thereof; thence running southwesterly, by the easterly side of said last mentioned highway, to land of the heirs of Kate M. Tucker; thence running southeasterly, by said land of the heirs of Tucker, to the Atlantic Ocean; thence running northeasterly, by the Atlantic Ocean, to the point of beginning.
