STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, to Create a Commission to Study and Revise Existing Inland Fish and Game Laws.

Commission to study and revise existing inland fish and game laws. Resolved: That the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is hereby authorized to appoint not less than 5 nor more than 9 competent persons to constitute a commission to make a study of the entire existing inland fish and game laws, and recommend necessary changes thereof and additions thereto; and be it further

At least I member to be member of a fish and game association. Resolved: That said commission shall have at least I member thereon who is a member of a fish and game association selected and approved by the joint fish and game associations of the state of Maine; and be it further

Report of commission. Resolved: That the members of the said commission shall complete their work and file their final report with the governor to be by him transmitted to the next regular legislature, said report to be so filed at least 3 months prior to the convening of said legislature; and be it further

Compensation. Resolved: That the members of the said commission shall receive \$10 per day and expenses of selves and clerical assistance while engaged in the discharge of their official duties; and be it further

Appropriation. Resolved: That the sum of \$15,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve. All unexpended balances shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing carrying account.
