STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT to Authorize the Transfer by the Spurwink Congregational Church and the Acceptance by the Inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth of the Spurwink Church and Property.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- **Sec. 1.** All corporate acts, doings and proceedings of the Spurwink Congregational Church of Cape Elizabeth are hereby ratified, confirmed and made valid.
- Sec. 2. The legal entity that is the Spurwink Congregational Church and its officers, agents, or proprietors or the survivors of them are hereby authorized and empowered to give, grant, convey, transfer, assign and set over to the Inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth, a body corporate, its successors or assigns, the real estate at Cape Elizabeth consisting of Spurwink Church and land underlying and appurtenant and the personal property or any of it, in Spurwink Church, to be held, conducted, managed, maintained and supported in perpetuam by the Inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth, its successors and assigns, as a cemetery chapel, community chapel and house of God for all who will use it reverently for any of such purposes.

Sec. 3. The Inhabitants of the Town of Cape Elizabeth, a body corporate, is hereby authorized and empowered to accept the title, for itself, its successors and assigns, to the real estate at Cape Elizabeth consisting of Spurwink Church and land underlying and appurtenant and the title to the personal property or any of it, in Spurwink Church and to hold, conduct, manage, maintain and support the said property, when acquired, in perpetuam, as a cemetery chapel, community chapel and house of God for all who will use it reverently for any such purpose.
