STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Prohibiting the Use of an Airplane in Driving, Hunting or Molesting any Wild Birds or Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S, c. 33, § 83-A, additional. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 83-A, to read as follows:

"Sec. 83-A. Use of airplane in driving and hunting wild birds or animals prohibited, penalty. No person shall use an airplane in driving, hunting or molesting any wild birds or animals.

Any person convicted of violating any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$300.'
