STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Joshua Treat Jr., of Winterport.

Joshua Treat Jr., of Winterport, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$200.43 to be paid to Joshua Treat, Jr., of Winterport, for 153 cartons of cigarettes confiscated by the bureau of taxation at the rate of \$1.31 per carton.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A mistake was made in sending check for these stamps to the internal revenue, but after learning of the error, check was sent to the state bureau of taxation.

This error caused a delay in receiving the stamps, and thus, our cigarettes were on hand over 72 hours which is the time described by law, before we could affix the stamps.
