RESOLVE, in Favor of Reginald Olivier, of Lewiston.

Reginald Olivier; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$144.05 from the general fund of the state to be paid to Reginald Olivier, of Lewiston, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to his car by a deer.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This accident occurred on November 13, 1946, around 7 P. M., in Monmouth, and was investigated by state police officer Merle Robinson. Game Warden Pearl Nelder also investigated the case. The damage to Mr. Olivier's car is as follows: right headlight broken; grill broken; radiator damaged; small dent in right front fender.
