STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Henry A. Moulton, Jr., of Biddeford.

Henry A. Moulton, Jr.; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$192 from the general fund of the state, to be paid to Henry A. Moulton, Jr., of Biddeford, as a full and final settlement for his claim against the state for damage to his automobile caused by its theft by boys escaped from the state school for boys.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On April 15, 1946, Henry A. Moulton, Jr., parked his Chevrolet Sedan 1940 model, in the yard at the home of his father Henry A. Moulton at Pine Point in Scarboro, Maine. During the night the car was taken by 5 boys who had just escaped from the state school for boys. The boys put some salt water in the radiator of the car and ran it very hot, resulting in the engine block being ruined and having to be replaced, and also burned out the clutch. The estimate of damage is \$192 for cost of repairs to the automobile.
