RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Annie M. Adams of North Edgcomb.

Teacher's pension granted to Annie M. Adams. Resolved: That a special pension be, and hereby is, granted to Annie M. Adams, of North Edgcomb, comparable with that paid under the teachers' noncontributory pension law, based on 25 years of teaching service, as is now or may hereafter be provided by the legislature, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1947 and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Miss Adams did her first teaching in Maine in 1895 and served for a period of 21 years. She then served in the Waltham, Massachusetts public schools for 1 year. This was followed by a period of service of 3 years in a private institution in Kentucky, and by a period of service of $\frac{1}{2}$ year in the public schools of Norwood, Massachusetts. Then she went to Shenandoah College in Virginia for a period of $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.

Subsequently she returned to Maine and has since served approximately 4 years of the required 15 in the public schools of the town of Edgecomb.

She was born January 23, 1876, and is now over 70 years of age.
