AN ACT Relative to Open Season on Partridge and Pheasants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 33, § 75, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 75 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘There shall be a closed season on partridge or grouse from November 16th to September 30th of the following year, both days inclusive, and no person shall, during the open season, have in possession in any 1 day more than ~~2~~ 1 partridge, or in any 1 open season for partridge or grouse more than 25 of the above named birds, nor shall any person at any time buy or sell any partridge or grouse.’

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 33, § 75, amended. The 5th paragraph of section 75 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘There shall be an annual ~~open~~ closed season on pheasants ~~beginning November 1, to and including November 15th of each calendar year from November 16th to September 30th of the following year, both days inclusive. All of the rest of the calendar year shall be closed season on~~

~~these birds.~~ No person shall have in his possession at any one time more than 2 pheasants, and there shall be a seasonal limit of 12 pheasants for any one person.'
