AN ACT Relating to Allocation of Moneys by Governor and Council.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 14, § 24, repealed and replaced. Section 24 of chapter 14 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 26 of the public laws of 1945, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 24. Allocations by governor and council. The governor, with the advice and consent of the council, may allocate such sums as may be appropriated for the contingent account by the legislature to meet any expense necessarily incurred under any requirement of law, or for the maintenance of government within the scope existing at the time of the previous session of the legislature or contemplated by laws enacted thereat, or to pay bills arising out of some emergency requiring an expenditure of money not provided by the legislature. The governor and council shall determine the necessity for such allocations, and all such allocations shall be supported by a statement of facts setting forth the necessity for the allocations.'
