IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Arrests of Intoxicated Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 95, amended. The last sentence of section 95 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows: 'Any such intoxicated person shall be taken into custody by any sheriff, deputy sheriff, **liquor inspector**, constable, marshal, police officer or watchman and committed to the watch-house or police station or restrained in some other suitable place, until a complaint can be made and a warrant issued against him, upon which he may be arrested and tried.'
