# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT Relating to Reserved Numbers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 25, amended. Section 25 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 25. Number plates reserved. The secretary of state shall reserve until the December November 1 preceding the year for which plates are issued the same registration number for the succeeding year for persons who shall, previous to said 1st day of December November, pay for the registration of his vehicle for the succeeding year, and otherwise comply with the provisions of the motor vehicle law. If a person wishes to retain his registration number and does not have a car to register on said December November 1st, he may hold his registration number by depositing with the secretary of state the sum of \$10 to be applied as part payment of the registration fee when plates are issued.

Application for registration numbers as herein provided shall be made on eards provided by the secretary of state.

All numbers other than those reserved as herein provided shall be released and issued in rotation after said <del>December</del> **November** 1, except that a person wishing to select a number out of rotation may do so by paying his registration fee and a reserved number fee of \$1.

The amount received from the fee charged for reserved numbers shall go into the general highway fund of the state.'
