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**RESOLVE, in Favor of Robert E. Cook of Portland.**

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**Robert E. Cook, compensated. Resolved:** That the county commissioners of Cumberland county be, and hereby are, authorized to pay to Robert E. Cook, of Portland, the sum of \$60 as a full and final settlement for reimbursement to him for amount previously paid by said Cook for portion of fine.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

On the 26th day of October, 1945 Robert E. Cook was convicted in the Portland municipal court for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of intoxicating liquor and sentenced to pay a fine of \$100 and costs of \$9.74. Pursuant thereto said Cook paid the probation officer for Cumberland county \$60 as a portion of said fine. Subsequently on the 6th day of November, 1946, the governor and council, after hearing, granted to Mr. Cook a full and free pardon. The only provision whereby Mr. Cook may recover the \$60 he thus paid is by means of a legislative resolve.
