IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Sale of Malt and Malt Syrup.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 61, repealed and replaced. Section 61 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 61. Sale of malt and malt syrup regulated; penalty. Malt or malt syrup shall not be sold in excess of 1 can to a customer, except for bakery or industrial purposes.

Any person selling in excess of 1 can of malt or malt syrup to a customer shall have the burden of proving that such sale was in fact for bakery or industrial purposes. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be punished by a fine of \$500 or by imprisonment for less than 1 year.'
