# STATE OF MAINE

### RESOLVE, Providing for Purchase of Land for the Bangor State Hospital.

**Commissioner of institutional service authorized to purchase land. Resolved:** That the commissioner of institutional service be, and hereby is, authorized to purchase for use by the Bangor State Hospital land situated in the city of Bangor and now owned by the city of Bangor.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The city of Bangor has offered to sell to the Bangor State Hospital a 20-acre piece of land 462 feet wide and 1881 feet long from Mount Hope avenue to the Morse farm. The state now owns the land on the south, east and north of this lot. The strip of land on the east side owned by the state is approximately 260 feet wide. The purchase of the above-mentioned 20-acre lot of land for use by the hospital is strongly recommended, as it would protect the narrow strip of approximately 260 feet wide connecting the Morse farm and other land owned by the state.

This piece of land was put up for bid by the city of Bangor to satisfy a tax lien. The city chose to hold it for acquisition by the state for use by the hospital rather than have the possibility of undesirable occupancy. The land can be purchased for \$300. Said purchase price to be paid from the appropriation of the Bangor State Hospital.
