AN ACT Relating to the Salary of Local Health Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 38, amended. Section 38 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 38. Municipalities may combine into districts; state aid. Subject to the approval of the commissioner, several towns, cities, or organized plantations may unite in employing the same local health officer, who shall possess the qualifications enumerated in section 29 or be approved by the commissioner on the basis of experience in public health administration. He shall devote his entire time to the performance of his duties, and shall receive $\frac{1}{3}$ of his salary, but not more than ~~\$800~~ \$1,500 a year, from the state.'
