STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Relative to the Digging of Clams in Lamoine.

Digging of clams in Lamoine, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rule and regulation:

'It shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Lamoine, in the county of Hancock, to dig or take clams, mussels, clam worms, sand worms or blood worms, for commercial purposes within the limits of said town.

Any person temporarily residing therein or the riparian owners of any clam flats may take therefrom for the immediate use of himself or family not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams a day.

Temporary residence shall exclude any form of living accommodations such as tents, trailers, trucks, automobiles, vehicles, or other form of living adjustment obviously intended to evade the intent of this rule and regulation.

Any person taking clams, mussels, clam worms, sand worms or blood worms contrary to the provisions hereof shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment'; and be it further **Enforcement. Resolved:** That the state police, state sea and shore fisheries wardens, sheriff of Hancock county, or constables in the town of Lamoine are hereby authorized to enforce the provisions of whatever rule and regulation is issued by the provisions of this resolve.
