**AN ACT Relating to Tagging and Marking of Beaver.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 33, § 100, sub-§ III, amended.** The 6th paragraph of subsection III of section 100 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All beaver skins must be presented in a **'green condition'** to the warden ~~supervisor~~ in whose ~~division~~ district they were caught and if said ~~super-~~  
~~visor~~ warden is ~~reasonably~~ satisfied that the beaver presented were legally trapped in his ~~division~~ district, he shall tag and mark the same in the manner as directed and with the materials furnished by the commissioner. **'Green condition'** shall mean that the beaver skins have been freshly removed from the beaver carcass and have been neither stretched, dried nor frozen. A fee of \$2 must be paid by the trapper for each skin tagged and marked.'
