AN ACT Relating to Log Driving Dams.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 10-A, additional. Chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 10-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 10-A. Building of dams, regulated; penalty. No person shall build any dam for purposes of holding a head of water for use in driving lumber, ties or pulpwood without first filing written notice with the commissioner of inland fisheries and game. No person shall permit any such dam to remain more than 1 year after the lumber ties or pulpwood has been driven. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of \$1,000 and costs. Each day any dam remains beyond the 1-year period shall be a separate offense.'
