RESOLVE, Authorizing the State Tax Assessor to Convey Certain Interest of the State in Lands in the Unorganized Territory.

State tax assessor authorized to convey certain lands. Resolved: That the state tax assessor be, and hereby is, authorized to convey to the individuals named below, whatever interest the state has in the following described parcels of land:
