STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams for Commercial Purposes in the Towns of Waldoboro and Bremen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

License required to dig or take clams for commercial purposes in towns of Waldoboro and Bremen; exception; penalty. No person, except as provided in this section, shall dig or take any clams, for commercial purposes, in the towns of Waldoboro and Bremen in the county of Lincoln, until he has procured a municipal license therefor.

The municipal officers of the towns of Waldoboro and Bremen are authorized to issue such licenses to legal residents of the towns and to fix the fee therefor. Such license shall entitle the person holding such license to dig or take clams for commercial purposes in either or both towns of Waldoboro and Bremen. A resident shall be considered a person who has lived in the state 6 months and in the town 3 months.

Any person may, without such license, dig or take clams for use as food, provided that the amount of clams so taken shall not exceed ½ bushel per day.

Any person may, without such license, dig or take clams for use as bait in an amount not to exceed 1 bushel per day.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days.
