**AN ACT Amending the Unemployment Compensation Law, as to
Disqualification for Benefits.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 24, § 5, sub-§ (e), amended. Subsection (e) of section 5 of chapter 24 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘(e) For any week with respect to which he is receiving or has received remuneration in the form of:

- (1) Dismissal wages or wages in lieu of notice which the employing unit is required by law to pay.
- (2) Compensation for temporary partial disability under the workmen’s compensation law of any state or under a similar law of the United States; **or old age benefit insurance, retirement pension from any other source;** or

(3) Repealed by c. 114 P. L. 1941.

Provided, that if such remuneration is less than the benefits which would otherwise be due under this act, he shall be entitled to receive for such week, if otherwise eligible, benefits reduced by the amount of such remuneration.

(4) Benefits under the unemployment compensation law of any state or similar law of the United States.'
