AN ACT Relating to Penalty for Posing as Indian in Vending.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 321, amended. Section 321 of chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'**Sec. 321. Penalty for posing as Indian in vending.** Whoever, not a member Indian of either of said tribes, represents himself to be such Indian in the vending of goods and wares, shall be punished by a fine of not more than ~~\$50~~ \$250.'
