**AN ACT Relating to Killing Bear in Certain Deorganized
Towns.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, §97, sub-§ III, amended. Subsection III of section 97 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

‘It shall be lawful to trap bear at any time in the deorganized towns of Orneville and Medford in Piscataquis county and it shall be lawful to hunt bear at any time in such deorganized towns except during Sundays and in the night-time.’
