RESOLVE, Relative to Fishing in Certain Somerset County Waters.

Fishing in certain Somerset county waters, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue the following rules and regulations:

(1) Opening to bait or fly-fishing from April 16 to September 15, and to fly-fishing only from September 16 to September 30, the waters of the East Branch of the Kennebec river from Moosehead lake to Indian pond in Somerset county, with a minimum length of 8 inches for trout and a daily bag limit of 15 trout.

(2) Prohibiting the use of smelts, shiners, chubs, minnows or other fish as bait in fishing the waters of Macdougall pond, so called, in the southwesterly part of Caratunk plantation, Somerset county, or in fishing the waters of East Carry pond, in Carrying Place township, Somerset county. Possession of smelts, shiners, chubs, minnows or other bait fish upon, or on or near the shore of, said waters shall be prima facie evidence of violation hereof.

(3) Establishing a daily bag limit of 5 trout in fishing the waters of Maccougall pond, so called, in the southwesterly part of Caratunk plantation, Somerset county.
