RESOLVE, Appropriating Moneys for Essential Facilities at Reid State Park.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, money should be available for work at Reid State Park at an early date; and

Whereas, the public will be able to use the facilities of this park during the summer months if work is commenced at an early date; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Reid State Park; appropriation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general fund of the state, the sum of \$80,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1948, and the sum of \$30,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1949, for the opening and development of essential facilities at Reid State Park; and be it further

Unexpended balances shall not lapse. Resolved: That any unexpended balances shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this resolve have been accomplished.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Reid State Park, when developed, will meet the demands of many residents of the state and out-of-state visitors, and it is desired to commence the program of work as soon as possible in order to be able to open the park to the public at as early a date as possible.
