**AN ACT Forbidding Impersonation of Liquor Inspectors.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 122, § 30, amended.** Section 30 of chapter 122 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Sec. 30. Falsely assuming to be an officer; penalty.** Whoever falsely assumes to be a justice of the peace, sheriff, deputy sheriff, **liquor inspector**, health officer, constable, inland fish and game warden, state humane agent, or state police officer, or who falsely acts as such, or who requires anyone to aid him in a matter pertaining to the duties of any such office which he does not hold, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
