STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to Privileges of Club Liquor Licensees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 50, amended. Section 50 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 50. Club fees. Any club maintaining a public dining-room and catering either privately or for functions to a group not members of the club, also any club with dining-rooms letting rooms to non-members, must pay the same fee as required by a hotel located in the same municipality; provided that any club having rooms on 2 floors shall have the privilege of renting rooms for private or public functions on the floor where no liquor is sold or served, and provided further that while any such rooms are so rented, liquor shall be served only to club members and not to guests.'
