AN ACT Relating to Catering by Club Liquor Licensees to Non-Members.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 57, § 50, repealed and replaced. Section 50 of chapter 57 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

‘Sec. 50. Catering by licensed clubs to non-members; fees. No licensed club shall maintain a public dining-room nor let or lend rooms to, or permit rooms to be used by non-members, nor cater either privately or for functions to groups of non-members; provided that clubs maintaining dining-rooms at the time of the effective date of this section, upon payment of the same fee required of hotels located in the same municipality, may be authorized by the commission to use their dining-room facilities or rooms for catering either privately or for functions to particular groups of non-members, the public not being invited or having access; and provided further, that any licensed club may let its rooms to non-members for public functions or cater for or entertain groups of non-members or the public for any occasions during which sale of liquor is entirely suspended on the club premises.’
