RESOLVE, to Create an Interim Committee to Study the Indian Problem.

Interim legislative committee created; compensation; report. Resolved: There is hereby created an interim legislative committee to make a study of the Indian problem. The committee shall be composed of 3 members: one from the senate, to be appointed by the president of the senate and 2 from the house of representatives, to be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives. Each member shall receive \$10 per day and expenses while engaged in the work of this committee. The committee shall report the results of their study at the next regular session of the legislature.
