RESOLVE, Relating to Teaching Service of Frank Kent, of Guilford.

Teacher's pension granted to Frank Kent, of Guilford. Resolved: That Frank Kent, of Guilford, be and hereby is, declared eligible to the provisions of sections 212 to 220, inclusive, of chapter 37 of the revised statutes of 1944, as amended by chapter 239 of the public laws of 1945.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Frank Kent, of Guilford, taught in the public schools of Reed Plantation in the spring of 1924 for a period of 6 weeks, and finished the school year at the urgent request of the superintendent of schools, and superintending school committee. Mr. Kent does not have a copy of the teaching credentials legalizing this teaching service nor is a copy available in the files of the state department of education. That this service was legalized is evidenced by the fact that the town received full subsidy for this teaching position. Mr. Kent now desires to count that service as a partial fulfillment of the requirements for a teacher's pension under the provisions of the law pertaining to teachers in service prior to July 1, 1924.
