STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Boothbay.

Town of Boothbay; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the town of Boothbay the sum of \$25,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1948, for the purpose of rebuilding and repairing roads destroyed in the storm of March 2, 1947; said sum to be taken from the general highway fund. Expenditure of the money provided by this resolve shall be under the supervision of the state highway commission and any balance of appropriation remaining unexpended at the end of any fiscal year shall be available for the same on any succeeding fiscal year.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

On March 2, 1947, a large number of roads in Boothbay were destroyed by a severe storm. Boothbay has 60 odd miles of road, a tax rate of 80 mills and a deficit of \$38,000. It needs assistance.
