STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Regulating Lights on Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 116, amended. Section 116 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 116. Regulation of spot, fog or auxiliary lights. There shall not be used on or in connection with any motor vehicle a spot light, so called, or more than 2 fog or auxiliary lights, so called, the rays from which shine more than 2 feet above the road at a distance of 30 feet from the vehicle, except that such spot light may be used for the purpose of reading signs, and as an auxiliary light the spot light or fog or auxiliary lights may be used in cases of necessity when the other lights required by law fail to operate. The fog or auxiliary light shall emit a white or amber beam of light.'
