STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, Granting a Pension to Mary E. Dunbar, of Portland.

Mary E. Dunbar; teacher's pension. Resolved: That a special pension be, and hereby is, granted to Mary E. Dunbar, of Portland, comparable with that paid under the teachers' noncontributory pension law, based on 25 years of teaching service, as is now or may hereafter be provided by the legislature, to be paid quarterly from the appropriation for pensions for retired teachers. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1947 and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Miss Mary E. Dunbar is now 73 years of age. She taught in Portland for 14 years when an intermission occurred, and for a while she was engaged in other work.

Later she taught in Portland for 10 more years, making a total of 24 years before she was 70 years of age.
