AN ACT Defining a Fish Weir.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 86, § 12, additional. Chapter 86 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 12, to read as follows:

'Sec. 12. "Fish weir", defined. The words "fish weir" mentioned in any of the 5 preceding sections are defined to be a fixed structure erected and maintained during any part of each fishing season in the tide water, constructed of spiling or stakes, supporting poles or binders, brush, lath racks or netting, forming one or more pounds or enclosures into which fish are led or guided by one or more fixed leaders and from which they cannot readily escape'
