STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Providing for Giving Complimentary Hunting and Fishing Licenses by Governor to Congressional Medal of Honor Holders.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 33, § 32, amended. The 5th paragraph of section 32 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All employees of the Veterans' Aministration Facility are hereby classified as residents of this state for the purpose of obtaining fishing licenses, and shall pay the same fees and be held to the same laws, rules and regulations as residents of this state. The governor may issue complimentary fishing and hunting licenses to members of the Canadian Immigration Customs Forces who serve in such capacity on the Maine border. For a period of 2 years, the governor may, upon application, grant complimentary hunting and fishing licenses to any holders of the Congressional Medal of Honor.'
