STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Digging of Clams in Lamoine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Digging of clams in Lamoine, regulated; penalty. No clams shall be taken from any flats within the limits of the town of Lamoine, in Hancock county, by any non-residents of said town; provided, however, that any person temporarily resident therein or any non-resident riparian owner of any such flats may take therefrom for the immediate use of himself or his family not exceeding I bushel of clams at I tide. A resident shall mean a person who has resided in this state for the term of at least 6 consecutive months, and in the town of Lamoine for 3 consecutive months.

Whoever violates any of the above provisions shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
