### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED FORTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of Hugh J. Andrews, of Waterville.

Hugh J. Andrews; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$105 to be paid to Hugh J. Andrews, of Waterville, as a full and final settlement of all claims against the state of Maine for expenses incurred in defending an alleged criminal charge brought against the said Hugh J. Andrews by the State Liquor Commission in behalf of the state of Maine. Said sum shall be appropriated from the appropriation of the liquor commission.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

In May, 1946, Hugh J. Andrews, of Waterville, an employee at the state liquor store in Waterville, was accused of making a sale of spirituous liquor to a minor. He was placed under arrest and had to prove his innocence before the courts of Maine. He was acquitted of the charge and feels that it is only fair that the state of Maine reimburse him for his expenses incurred to defend himself on what he feels was a false charge.
